REPAIR OF HIGHWAYS

2504. SHRI KULDEEP INDORA:

Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS सड़क परिवहन और राजमार्ग मंत्री

be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government has issued any new guidelines to National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) which is responsible for the maintenance and development of National Highways for ensuring the longevity and continuous improvement of the country's vital road network;

(b) whether the Government has directed the NHAI to immediately repair the damaged highways in Rajasthan; and

(c) the steps that are being taken for strengthening the overall road infrastructure in Rajasthan with a particular reference to Sriganganagar and Hanumangarh districts?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

(SHRI NITIN JAIRAM GADKARI)

(a) Development and maintenance of National Highways (NHs) is a continuous process. Works on notified NHs, including capacity augmentation, are taken up based on the traffic density, condition of the road, inter-se priority and synergy with PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan.

The Government has planned that all NHs sections of National Highways should be under Maintenance, through one of the following mechanisms:

- Maintenance & Repair (M&R) of stretches of NHs, where development works have commenced or Operation, Maintenance and Transfer (OMT) Concessions/ Operation and Maintenance (O&M) Contracts have been awarded, are the responsibility of the concerned Concessionaires/ Contractors till the end of the Defect Liability Period (DLP)/ the Concession Period. Similarly, for NHs stretches undertaken under TOT (Toll Operate and Transfer) and InvIT (Infrastructure Investment Trust), M&R responsibility lies with concerned Concessionaire till the end of the Concession Period.
- For all remaining sections of NHs stretches, Government has taken a policy decision to undertake maintenance works through Performance-Based Maintenance Contract (PBMC) or Short-Term Maintenance Contract (STMC).

(b) Repair of any damages on NHs is a continuous process and is taken up whenever such damages occur.

(c) Following 06 project highways have been developed in Sriganganagar and Hanumangarh districts by the Government:
