#### RISING ACCIDENTS DUE TO BLACK SPOTS

# 2514. ADV. ADOOR PRAKASH:

### Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

## be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware of increasing incidents of vehicle accidents in 'black spots' on highways across the country, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has identified such 'black spots' which are accidents-prone and is providing financial assistance for taking necessary safety measures, of so, the details thereof;
- (c) the number of such places identified, State-wise, and the corrective measures taken so far; and
- (d) the details of 'black spots' identified in the State of Kerala and the present status of works?

#### **ANSWER**

#### THE MINISTER OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

#### (SHRI NITIN JAIRAM GADKARI)

(a) to (c) Government has finalized criteria for identification of road accident spots as black spot depending on number of accidents in three consecutive calendar years involving fatalities and grievous injuries. Based on the road accident data provided by all the State/UT Governments, Government has identified 13,795 nos. of black spots on various National Highways (NHs) in the Country. Out of total 13,795 black spots identified on the NHs in the country, long-term

rectification has been completed on 5,036 black spots. For timely rectification of the blackspots, the Government has issued guidelines in August, 2019 and delegated powers to field officers for taking up the immediate measures for rectification of blackspots based on the site inspection. The state-wise details are Annexed.

(d) Government has identified 692 numbers of blackspots in the state of Kerala. Further, Government has issued guidelines for immediate short-term rectification measures on black spots like road markings, signages, crash barriers, road studs, delineators, closure of median openings, traffic calming measures, etc. Long-term measures like improvement of road geometrics, junction improvements, spot widening of carriageway, construction of underpasses/overpasses, etc. are also taken for permanent rectification of black spots.

Rectification of black spots is a continuous process, and temporary measures are taken on immediate basis. Out of total 692 black spots identified on the NHs in the state of Kerala, short-term rectification measures have been completed on 420 black spots and long-term rectification have been completed on 66 black spots.
