Will the Minister of **COMMERCE & INDUSTRY** (वाणिज्य एवं उद्योग मंत्री) be pleased to

state:

(a) the details of current status of India's trade agreements with various countries;

(b) the number of trade agreements were signed last year;

(c) whether they were renewed or are under consideration; and

(d) if so, the details of initiatives taken by the Ministry to boost Indian exports, especially in the sectors of textiles, pharmaceuticals and IT?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRI JITIN PRASADA)

(a) A list of Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) and Preferential Trade Agreements (PTAs) India has signed is at **Annexure**.

(b) & (c) India has signed a Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement with the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) on 10 March 2024. The Agreement will be implemented after completion of ratification process by India and the EFTA countries. Further, to augment India's export, India has also initiated review of its existing FTAs, namely, India-South Korea CEPA, and ASEAN-India Trade in Goods Agreement (AITIGA).

(d) Department of Commerce provides financial assistance under the Market Access Initiative (MAI) Scheme to Export Promotion Council (EPC), Trade Bodies, Commodity Boards etc. for facilitating participation of Indian Exporters in exhibitions, buyer-seller meets (BSMs), fairs, etc. in India and abroad helping them to showcase their products in international markets and to establish business contacts with foreign buyers. The commodities and territories, are prioritized for MAI assistance on an annual basis, in consultation with the industry bodies and other stakeholders. Districts as Export Hubs initiative has been launched by identifying products with export potential in each district to generate employment in the district. Active role of Indian missions abroad towards promoting India's trade, tourism, technology and investment goals has been enhanced. Regular monitoring of export performance with Commercial Missions abroad, EPCs, Commodity Boards/ Authorities and Industry Associations and taking corrective measures is undertaken. Further, the government has launched Trade Connect e-Platform to provide comprehensive services for both new and existing exporters. The above initiatives are for all sectors.
