Will the Minister of SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT be pleased to state:

(a) the targeted health and life cover insurance scheme for Persons with Disabilities in operation in the country at present;

(b) whether the Niramaya Health Insurance Scheme is still in operation and if so, the details of funds allocated and utilized thereunder during the last three years;

(c) the number of beneficiaries under Niramaya Swasthya Bima Yojna in Sambhaji Nagar in the State of Maharashtra as on date; and

(d) whether the Government is considering to include Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) in Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY), and if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

(a) National Trust is implementing the Niramaya (Health Insurance Scheme) for persons with Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation (Intellectual disability) and Multiple Disabilities

(b) Yes, Niramaya (Health Insurance Scheme) is operational. The details of funds utilized under the scheme during the last 3 years is as under: -

(c) The number of beneficiaries enrolled/renewed under Niramaya Swasthya Bima Yojana in Sambhaji Nagar in Maharashtra is 80.

(d) Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri - Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY) is a flagship scheme of the Government which provides health cover of Rs. 5 lakhs per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization to approximately 55 Cr beneficiaries corresponding to 12.37 Crore families constituting economically vulnerable bottom 40% of India's population. With respect to the inclusion of Persons with Disabilities (PwD) under AB PM-JAY, it may kindly be noted that the scheme's beneficiary base includes poor and vulnerable families identified in the Socio-Economic Caste Census (SECC-2011). The SECC-2011 incorporates deprivation criteria for rural areas, one of which is "Disabled member and no able-bodied adult member".
