Will the Minister of Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state:

- a) the funds allocated and utilized under the Broadcasting Infrastructure

 Network Development (BIND) scheme during each of the last five years;
- b) the number of projects initiated under this scheme to improve Doordarshan and All India Radio infrastructure particularly in Gujarat along with their current status;
- c) the specific measures taken to enhance accessibility and transmission quality of Doordarshan and All India Radio in border and Left-Wing Extremism-affected areas and the reported impact of these measures;
- d) the details of provisions of the scheme for local or regional content development to cater to linguistic and cultural diversity; and
- e) the plans to integrate emerging technologies like AI and 5G to further modernize broadcasting infrastructure under this scheme?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (DR. L. MURUGAN)

(a): Government has approved a Central Sector Scheme namely Broadcasting Infrastructure and Network Development (BIND) scheme for development, modernization and upgradation of broadcasting infrastructure of Prasar Bharati in the country for the years 2021-26. The funds utilized under the BIND scheme, during each of the last five years, are as under:

- (b) to (d): Modernization, upgradation and expansion of broadcasting infrastructure and network is a continuous process which is being undertaken under BIND scheme in the country including state of Gujarat, through a number of projects such as modernization & digitization of transmitters & studios, expansion of DTH & TV channels, expansion of DD Free Dish DTH Platform, Automation & modernization of production & transmission facilities, content generation & technology for content innovation, expansion of reach of public service broadcasting in strategic, border, Left Wing Extremism (LWE) areas & vibrant villages, etc. An amount of Rs. 450 cr. has been earmarked under this scheme for content development & content innovation across the country for the years 2021-26, out of which more than Rs 367 cr has already been spent.
- (e): Under BIND Scheme, a pilot project on Artificial Intelligence (AI)/
 Machine Learning (ML) has been included.
