## WOMEN AND CHILD COUNSELLING CENTRES

#### 3504. SHRI MAGUNTA SREENIVASULU REDDY: SHRI PUTTA MAHESH KUMAR:

Will the Minister of Women and Child Development be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has undertaken any schemes/Programmes/ initiatives for the construction and development of Women and Child Counselling Centres across the country;
- (b) if so, the details of such programmes/schemes/initiatives and the funds allocated/utilised for the same during the last five years, State-wise and district-wise in Andhra Pradesh;
- (c) the number of women and child counselling centres proposed, approved and presently functional across the country, State-wise and districts-wise including Prakasam and Eluru district in said State;
- (d) the number of women and child specialist psychologists, therapists and psychiatrists' positions available along with those presently employed and vacancies in child counselling centres in the country, State-wise and districtwise in the said State; and
- (e) whether the Government has put forward any guidelines/manual regarding the functioning/maintenance of child counselling centres, if so, the details thereof?

## ANSWER

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI SAVITRI THAKUR)

(a) to (c): The One Stop Centre (OSC) is a component of the Sambal vertical under Mission Shakti provides integrated support and assistance under one roof to women affected by violence and those in distress, both in private and public spaces. It also provides services like medical aid, legal aid and advice, temporary shelter, police assistance and psycho-social counselling to needy women. As the scheme is demand driven, the States and UTs are encouraged to set-up at least one OSC in each district and additional OSC(s) in those districts which have higher rate of crime against women or have bigger geographical area and in aspirational districts. As on date, 894 OSCs are approved and out of which, 802 OSCs are operational across the country either in own building or pre-existing government building or rented accommodation. The State wise approved and operational OSCs is at **Annexure-I.** The details of district-wise approved and operational OSCs in Andhra Pradesh including Prakasam and Eluru district is at **Annexure-II**. Details of State-wise funds released for the One Stop Centres (OSCs) during the last five years are at **Annexure-III.** 

Further, the Ministry is implementing a Centrally Sponsored Scheme namely, 'Mission Vatsalya' through States/Union Territories to deliver various services for Children in Need of Care and Protection and Children in Conflict with Law. It includes both Institutional Care services and Non-Institutional Care services. Institutional Care is provided through the Child Care Institutions, as a rehabilitative measure. The programmes and activities in Homes, *inter-alia,* include age-appropriate education, access to vocational training, recreation, health care, counselling etc. Under the Non-Institutional Care component, support is provided to the children through Adoption, Foster Care, After Care and Sponsorship. There is provision of counsellor in the District Child Protection Unit and in the Child Care Institution also.

The Ministry of Women and Child Development in collaboration with National Institute of Mental Health & Neurosciences (NIMHANS), Bengaluru established Support, Advocacy & Mental Health Interventions for Children in Vulnerable Circumstances and Distress (SAMVAD), a national initiative & integrated resource for child protection, mental health, & psychosocial care, that provides training and capacity building and other forms of guidance and technical support, to child protection functionaries.

(d) and (e): As per the Mission Shakti guidelines, the Central Government provides 100% financial assistance to States/ UTs for appointment/hiring 13 manpower resources including 1 Psycho-social Counsellor at each OSC. The overall implementation of the OSC scheme lies with the State Governments/UT

Administrations. The Ministry has issued 'Mission Shakti' and 'Mission Vatsalya' guideline for implementation of women and child related schemes during 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission period 2021-22 to 2025-26.
