Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the number and name of institutions which have been granted Institute of Eminence status along with the details of their public-private distribution;
- (b) whether any high-performing Indian Universities is setting up their campuses; and
- (c) the name of Universities from top 100 foreign Universities in the world which are setting up their campuses in India as mentioned in NEP, 2020?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (DR. SUKANTA MAJUMDAR)

- (a): There are 12 institutions that have been granted Institute of Eminence (IoE) status by the Ministry of Education. Among them, eight are public institutions namely, IIT Bombay, IIT Delhi, IIT Madras, IIT Kharagpur, IISc Bangalore, BHU Varanasi, University of Hyderabad and University of Delhi and four are private institutions namely, BITS Pilani, Manipal Academy of Higher Education, O.P. Jindal Global University and Shiv Nadar University, Greater Noida.
- (b) and (c): IIT Madras and IIT Delhi have set up their campuses in Zanzibar, Tanzania and Abu Dhabi, UAE, respectively. Letter of Intent (LoI) has been issued to University of Southampton, United Kingdom for setting up a campus in Gurugram, Haryana under UGC (Setting up and Operation of Campuses of Foreign Higher Institutions in India) Regulations 2023. Two Australian universities, namely Deakin University and University of Wollongong have established their campuses in GIFT City, Gujarat under International Financial Services Centres Authority (Setting up and Operation of International Branch Campuses and Offshore Education Centres) Regulations 2022.
