Setting up of National Level Youth Centre or Sports Academy in Meerut

†3900. Shri Arun Govil:

Will the Minister of YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Meerut is a youth-dominated city with immense potential for education, sports and skill development;
- (b) if so, whether there is a need to expand sports facilities, establish skill development centres for youth empowerment and implement special schemes under the National Youth Policy;
- (c) the plan of the Government to establish a national level youth centre or sports academy in Meerut so that the youth can get better opportunities;
- (d) whether the Government proposes to set up special training centres to provide more employable skills to the youth of Meerut; and
- (e) the schemes of the Government to develop sports infrastructure in Meerut so that the youth can get a better platform to compete at the national and international level?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS (DR. MANSUKH MANDAVIYA)

- (a) to (e): 'Sports' being a State subject, the responsibility of development and encouragement of sports in the country, rests primarily with the State/Union Territory Governments, and the Central Government only supplements their efforts. However, the Government is running various sports promotional schemes across the country, including Uttar Pradesh. These schemes include:
- (i) Khelo India- National Programme for Development of Sports; (ii) Assistance

to National Sports Federations (NSFs); (iii) Cash Awards to Winners in International Sports Events and their Coaches; (iv) National Sports Awards; (v) Pension to Meritorious Sportspersons; (vi) Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay National Sports Welfare Scheme; (vii) National Sports Development Fund (NSDF); and (viii) Running Sports Training Centres (STCs) through Sports Authority of India (SAI). Details of these schemes are available in the public domain on the website of the Ministry at https://yas.nic.in/.

Under the component "Creation and Up-gradation of Sports Infrastructure" of the Khelo India Scheme, various sports infrastructure projects are sanctioned across the country, including UP. Till date, 30 infrastructure projects have been sanctioned in the state of UP, including 2 in Meerut. Details of the projects are available at https://mdsd.kheloindia.gov.in/.

Further, under Sports Authority of India (SAI), at present, one Extension Centre of STC i.e. Gurukul Archery Academy is functional at Meerut in the discipline of Archery with 11 athletes.

There is no scheme under the National Youth Policy 2014, however, it is a guiding document for a number of Central Ministries/ Departments, including the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, which have implemented/ are implementing schemes/ programmes having bearing on development and empowerment of youth.

Under the Government of India's Skill India Mission (SIM), the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) delivers skill, re-skill and up-skill training through an extensive network of skill development centres / institutes etc. under various schemes, viz. Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS), National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial

Training Institutes (ITIs), to all the sections of the society across the country including state of Uttar Pradesh. The SIM aims at enabling youth of India to get future ready and equipped with industry relevant skills.

The Schemes of MSDE are demand driven and the Training Centres are set up or engaged on need basis. Details of the Training Centres set up or engaged are as under:
