#### 3901. DR. D RAVI KUMAR:

Will the Minister of CULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has any plans to digitize the historical records, manuscripts and archival collections at the Puducherry Record Centre and make them accessible to the public online, if so, the details along with the timeline for implementation;
- (b) the details of the amount sanctioned along with the initiatives being taken by the Government to further develop and modernise the Puducherry Record Centre, including infrastructure upgrades and preservation techniques;
- (c) the details of the ongoing efforts to acquire additional private archival collections, palm leaf manuscripts or historical documents to expand the Puducherry Record Centre's repository; and
- (d) the details of the steps that have been taken by the Government to promote research and academic engagement with the archival records stored at the Puducherry Record Centre, along with any new initiatives to enhance accessibility for scholars and researchers?

#### **ANSWER**

# MINISTER OF CULTURE AND TOURISM (GAJENDRA SINGH SHEKHAWAT)

- (a): Yes. The work of digitization of historical records, manuscripts and archival collections available in the Puducherry Record Centre of National Archives of India has already been commenced from 28<sup>th</sup> March 2024. The timeline for implementation of this work is two years. This whole value chain starts from the process of preservation, conservation and digitization to make it available to the end user.
- (b): Every year, the infrastructure is developed in Puducherry Record Centre and new preservation techniques are being implemented to modernize the Record Centre in a scientific manner. Research Rooms, Conservation Rooms, Digitization Rooms, all Repositories are being modernized from time to time. The details of the amount sanctioned to CPWD, Puducherry Division for carrying out the infrastructure development of Puducherry Record Centre is given at Annexure.

(c): Puducherry Record Centre has a huge private archival collection, as detailed hereunder:
