Will the Minister of STATISTICS AND PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is true that the unemployment rate of youth in the country is the highest in the world and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the sample designs of national surveys also yielded the same figures and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of data regarding unemployment rate in the country including the Union Territory of Dadra and Nagar Haveli during each of the last five years, State/UT-wise; and
- (d) whether concrete steps are being taken by the Government to reduce the unemployment rate and create/provide more employment opportunities in the country and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) and (b): The Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) has been conducting Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) since 2017 to estimate various indicators related to employment and unemployment situation in the country. In this survey, persons of age 15-29 years are considered as youth. From this survey, the estimates of Unemployment rate in usual status (ps+ss) for persons of age 15-29 years at all-India level for the last five years is given below:
