FUNDS ALLOCATION UNDER SCM**

NO. 4496. SHRI JANARDAN SINGH SIGRIWAL:

Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the budget allocated under Smart Cities Mission (SCM) during the last five years and the current year, State-wise;**
- (b) the names of the cities identified under SCM in Bihar, phase-wise;**
- (c) the details of the districts in Bihar for which essential funds have been allocated under the said mission to develop them as smart cities along with the funds utilised so far;**
- (d) whether the work of smart city project in the said identified cities is likely to be completed on time;**
- (e) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and**
- (f) the steps taken/being taken by the Government to expedite the work along with the progress report of the above said work?**

ANSWER

**THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE
MINISTRY OF HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS
(SHRI TOKHAN SAHU)**

- (a) Smart Cities Mission (SCM) was launched on 25.06.2015. The Central Government has a total outlay of ₹48,000 crore for the 100 cities covered under SCM. The State/UT wise details of cities selected and central financial assistance claimed by them, since inception of the Mission, are at Annexure-I.**
- (b) & (c) Four cities viz. Bhagalpur in Fast Track cities, Patna and Muzaffarpur in round-2 and Biharsharif in round-3 have been selected under SCM from the State of Bihar. These cities are able to claim central financial assistance amounting to ₹1,735 crore, out of which ₹1,669 crore (96% of the total central financial assistance) have been utilized, city-wise details of which are at Annexure-II. The district-wise details of central financial assistance claimed and utilized is not maintained at central level.**

- (d) & (e) On the requests received from the States/ UTs, Government of India has extended the Smart Cities Mission (SCM) up to 31.03.2025 for completion of its ongoing projects.**
- (f) The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) has a multi-level review structure to expedite the progress of projects under the SCM. At the National level, implementation is monitored by an Apex Committee headed by Secretary, MoHUA. At the State level, Mission implementation is monitored by the State level High Powered Steering Committee (HPSC) chaired by the Chief Secretary. At the City level, there is a provision for establishing Smart City Advisory Forum (SCAF) for all 100 smart cities to advise and enable collaboration among various stakeholders.**
