#### LINKING OF RIVERS IN MAHARASHTRA

#### 4547. SHRI ANIL YESHWANT DESAI

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Government is working on linking of various rivers to regulate water distribution in order to save the countrymen from flood and famine in various parts of the country;
- (b) if so, the details of the major rivers that are scheduled to be linked with each other in the country, Statewise, particularly in Maharashtra;
- (c) whether there is any timeline scheduled to complete this mega task and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the details of the funds allocated for the same including that from the World Bank?

#### **ANSWER**

#### THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI

(SHRI RAJ BHUSHAN CHOUDHARY)

(a) to (c) The Government of India formulated a National Perspective Plan (NPP) in the year 1980. The National Water Development Agency (NWDA) has been entrusted with the work of Interlinking of Rivers (ILR) under the NPP. These link projects under the NPP have been planned judicially and are envisaged to provide for storage and transfer of water from the water-surplus basins to the water-deficit basins/ regions to minimize the miseries brought by droughts and also to mitigate the ravages of annually recurring floods.

Under the NPP, 30 link projects have been identified, 16 link projects under the Peninsular component and 14 link projects under the Himalayan component. Out of these 30 link projects, Pre-Feasibility Reports (PFRs) of all the 30 link projects, Feasibility Reports (FRs) of 26 link projects and Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) of 11 link projects have been completed. The details and present status of the all link projects, including those benefiting the State of Maharashtra and also indicating therein the major rivers to be linked through the respective link projects, are given at **Annexure-I.** 

Five projects have been identified as the Priority link projects, viz; Ken-Betwa Link Project (KBLP), Godavari- Cauvery (GC) Link [comprising 3 links, namely, Godavari (Inchampalli)-Krishna (Nagarjunasagar) link, Krishna (Nagarjunasagar)-Pennar (Somasila) link and Pennar (Somasila)-Cauvery link] and the modified Parbati-Kalisindh-Chambal Link Project.

The Government of India is keenly pursuing the ILR programme in a consultative manner and has accorded top priority to it. Concerted efforts at various levels have been made to build necessary consensus amongst the party States, for implementation of various ILR projects. A "Special Committee on Inter-

linking of Rivers" has been constituted in September, 2014 for the implementation of ILR programme. 21 meetings of the Special Committee have been held so far. Further, a Task Force for Inter-linking of Rivers has been constituted in April, 2015 for expediting the works under the ILR programme and 18 meetings of this Task Force have been held so far. States have wide representation and active participation in these meetings.

The KBLP is the first and only inter linking river project under the NPP, of which the implementation has already started. Subsequent to the party States arriving at a consensus and signing a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) for implementation of this link project, the Union Cabinet approved the proposal, in December, 2021, for implementation of the project at an estimated cost of Rs. 44,605 crore, with a Central Support of Rs. 39,317 crore. The project is scheduled to be completed by March, 2030.

For other ILR projects under the NPP, the schedule of completion cannot be deduced as this depends upon the party States arriving at a consensus for their respective link projects and signing the link specific MoAs for their implementation.

(d) Details of Budget Allocation by the Government of India for the KBLP, implementation of which started after approval by the Union Cabinet in December, 2021, is given at **Annexure-II**. No funding from the World Bank is there for the ILR projects.
