**PROMOTION OF MSME SECTOR IN BIHAR**

4557. SHRI ABHAY KUMAR SINHA:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is implementing any special scheme to promote the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) sector in Bihar, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the number of new MSME industries established in Bihar during the last five years and the number of people got employment thereunder, district-wise;
- (c) whether any new policy is being implemented by the Government to promote traditional industries of Bihar such as handloom, pottery, agro-based small industries and the carpet industry of Aurangabad; and
- (d) the steps being taken by the Government to provide financial assistance, market availability and technological advancement support to small and medium enterprises in Bihar?

**ANSWER**

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES  
(SUSHRI SHOBHA KARANDLAJE)

- (a): No Sir. The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MoMSME) does not implement any special scheme to promote MSMEs in Bihar. The Schemes of the Ministry are implemented throughout the country.
- (b): The number of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises established in Bihar, district-wise, along with the number of persons employed during the period 01/02/2020 to 15/03/2025 is given in *Annexure – I*.
- (c): The Ministry of MSME is not implementing any new policy to promote traditional industries of Bihar such as handloom, pottery, agro-based small industries and carpet industry in Bihar. However, MoMSME implements schemes such as Khadi and Gramodyog Vikas Yojana (KGVY), PM Vishwakarma, Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI), MSE Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP) etc., for promoting traditional industries in all States/UTs of the country, including Bihar.
- (d): MoMSME implements the following schemes for providing financial assistance, market development, and technology support for MSMEs in all the States/UTs in the country, including Bihar:

- a. The Ministry provides financial assistance to prospective/existing MSMEs through schemes like (i) Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), which provides Margin Money subsidy upto 35% for setting up new micro enterprises in the non-farm sector (ii) Credit Guarantee Scheme (CGS) for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs ), wherein collateral-free loans upto Rs 500 lakhs with guarantee coverage upto 90% are provided,(iii) Special Credit Linked Capital Subsidy Scheme (SCLCSS) which provides subsidy of 25% to SC/ST Micro and Small Enterprises on institutional finance for procurement of plant and machinery, (iv)PM VishwakarmaYojana provides end to end support to artisans and craftspeople of 18 trades who work with their hands and tools and support in skilling, modern toolkits, subsidized credit, marketing support and digital transaction incentives is provided. (v) Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance ( RAMP) provides grants to States for implementation of projects that have been proposed by the States and approved by the Ministry, etc.
- b. For promoting market for MSMEs, the Ministry implements various schemes like the Procurement and Marketing Support scheme, which extends benefits to MSEs for gaining market access through participation in Trade Fairs, Exhibitions, Vendor Development Programmes, adoption of modern packaging techniques, on-boarding on to ecommerce platforms etc. International Cooperation Scheme helps MSMEs participate in International Trade Fairs. MSME Trade Enablement and Marketing Initiative supports MSEs to onboard ONDC e-commerce platform. PM Vishwakarma Scheme provides support to artisans and craftspersons in the areas of marketing, branding, packaging, participation in various trade fairs, state level exhibitions, and assistance in digital marketing. Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises mandates that all Central Ministries/ Departments/ Public Sector Enterprises must procure at least 25% of their annual procurement from Micro and Small Enterprises.
- c. Technological support is provided through the RAMP programme and MSME Champions scheme, which supports MSMEs in quality certification, resource efficiency, Innovation, Digitization and Intellectual Property Rights. The network of Technology Centres / Tool Rooms in the country supports MSMEs by providing access to advanced manufacturing technologies, training & skilling, and business consultancy services to make the MSMEs more competitive.
