Will the Minister of Women and Child Development be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of operational One-Stop Centres (OSCs) across the country as on February 2025, Sambal Programme/Scheme under the Mission Shakti, Statewise, particularly in Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Delhi and Amroha Parliamentary Constituency of Uttar Pradesh;
- (b) the number of women assisted under the scheme/programme, State-wise, particularly in the said States;
- (c) whether the said scheme/programme provide temporary shelter facilities/dedicated emergency vehicles for responding to cases of violence against women at these centres particularly in said States/costituency; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI SAVITRI THAKUR) (a) to (d): The One Stop Centre (OSC) is a component of the Sambal vertical under the umbrella Mission Shakti. It provides integrated support and assistance under one roof to women affected by violence and those in distress, both in private and public spaces. It provides services like medical aid, legal aid and advice, **temporary shelter**, police assistance and psycho-social counselling to needy women. As on date, 812 OSCs are operational across the country including Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Delhi and Amroha Parliamentary Constituency of Uttar Pradesh. These Centres have assisted over 10.80 lakh women till 31.01.2025. State/UT-wise details of operational OSCs and women assisted are at Annexure. The Government has also made provision for hiring of dedicated emergency vehicle for the OSCs.
