### 4653. Shri Manickam Tagore B: Shri Vijayakumar Alias Vijay Vasanth:

Will the Minister of *Ayush* be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware that the AYUSH Research Portal currently hosts over 43,000 studies, establishing India as a global leader in evidence-based traditional medicine, if so, the details thereof along with the number of new studies that have been added to the portal in the last year and any future plans for expanding this database;
- (b) the total funding allocated to the AYURGYAN scheme for the current financial year;
- (c) whether the Government has specific details on how this funding has been utilized for research, education and innovation in AYUSH practices across various States in the country and if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the details of the funding allocated to the AYUSH-ICMR Advanced Centre for Integrated Health Research at AIIMS including the total amount for Financial Year, 2025; and
- (e) the manner in which plan to integrate traditional AYUSH practices with modern medical science through this Centre and specific projects which are underway in this regard?

# THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYUSH (SHRI PRATAPRAO JADHAV)

(a) Yes, AYUSH Research Portal currently hosts over 43,000 Ayush research studies, establishing India as a global leader in evidence-based traditional medicine. Total number of articles that have been added to the portal in the last year are as follows:

Further, as this is an ongoing activity, the addition of the new studies is a continuous process.

- (b) & (c): An amount of Rs.25.80 Crore has been allocated under Ayurgyan Scheme during this Current Financial Year. Under the said scheme, funds are not allocated/granted/released to State/UT-wise. Fund is provided to the eligible Organizations/Institutions as per provision contained in the scheme guidelines. Further, the details of the organizations supported for the projects under the Ayurgyan Scheme during the current FY-2024-25 is at Annexure I.
- (d): The funding allocated to Ayush-ICMR Advanced Centre for Integrated Health Research (AI-ACIHR) at AIIMS including the total amount for Financial year 2025 is Rs 30,29,04,028 (Rupees thirty crores twenty-nine lacs four thousand and twenty-eight only) for a period of three years. For the financial year 2025 funding allocated is Rs 13,58,67,828 (Thirteen Crore Fifty eight lakhs sixty seven thousand eight hundred and twenty eight rupees only). Total funding includes total budgetary requirements for five AI-ACIHR and total Secretariat Budget for three years duration.
- (e): Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences (CCRAS) under Ministry of Ayush have jointly funded to set up Ayush-ICMR Advanced Centre for Integrative Health Research (AI-ACIHR), at AIIMS under specific Centre for Advanced Research (CAR) proposal scheme of ICMR. These advanced centres aim to conduct research on identified priority areas focusing on integrative health care to generate robust evidence for development of Integrative management protocols and to develop guidelines to facilitate cross referrals utilizing the integrative medicine approach. A total of twelve proposals have been shortlisted from five AI-ACIHR. Details of the centre along with specific projects have been given in Annexure II.
