DEVELOPMENT OF CRUISE TOURISM

4707.SHRI ADITYA YADAV:

Will the Minister of PORTS, SHIPPING AND WATERWAYS be pleased to state: पत्तन, पोत परिवहन और जलमार्ग मंत्री

(a) whether the Government has taken cognizance of the fact that cruise tourism in the country is still an unexplored, niche sector;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) the steps taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to create an enabling ecosystem for the development of Cruise Tourism in India keeping in mind that at present Indian represents just one percent of the overall international cruising sector?

ANSWER

(a) to (c) The Government of India has launched Cruise Bharat Mission (CBM) on 30th September, 2024. CBM provides for a framework for inter-ministerial approach for crafting interventions along policy, regulatory, and other aspects governing cruise sector and enable responsible involvement of all regulatory agencies, such as Customs, Immigration, CISF, State Tourism Departments, State Maritime Agencies, District Administrations, and local police.
