**Ayurvedic and Homoeopathy Research Centre**

**†4736. Shri Satpal Brahamchari:**

Will the Minister of AYUSH be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of number of Ayurveda and homoeopathic Research Centres set up in Haryana by the Government during the last five years, district-wise;
- (b) whether sufficient amount has been allocated for setting up such centres and if so, the details thereof, district-wise;
- (c) whether the Government has received any proposal regarding allocation of additional funds for Sonipat Parliamentary Constituency; and
- (d) the other steps taken by the Government to boost research and development in homoeopathy in Haryana?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (b) There are no Ayurveda and Homoeopathic Research centres set up in Haryana by the Government during the last five years.

(c) The apex research organizations under the aegis of Ministry of Ayush for Ayurveda and Homoeopathy systems of medicine i.e. Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences (CCRAS) and the Central Council for Research in Homoeopathy (CCRH) have not received any proposal for allocation of additional funds for Sonipat Parliamentary Constituency.

(d) The steps taken by the Government to boost research and development in homoeopathy in Haryana are given below: -

(1) Central Council for Research in Homoeopathy (CCRH) an apex body for scientific research in Homoeopathy under the Ministry of Ayush undertakes research activities such as Clinical Research, Drug Proving, Drug Verification, Drug validation, Drug Standardization, Public Health Research, Fundamental Research and Epidemic research either in intramural mode or in collaboration with different Universities/ institutes of repute, such as:

- i. MoU has been signed between CCRH and Translational Health Science and Technology Institute (THSTI), Faridabad, Haryana for evaluating the immunological effects of Arsenicum album 30C against SARS-CoV-2 infection.

- ii. A study titled "Homoeopathy as an Adjuvant to Standard Care in Moderate and Severe Cases of COVID-19: A Single-Blind, Randomized, Placebo-Controlled Study" was conducted in Oct-Dec 2020, at AIIMS, Jhajjar.
- iii. CCRH collaborated with AIIMS, Jhajjar for a study titled, "A pilot study evaluating role of Homoeopathic medicine in Lung Cancer patients as adjuvant treatment to chemotherapy/radiotherapy, and correlating with Molecular Markers" during July, 2024.

CCRH undertakes coordinates, develops, disseminates and promotes scientific research in Homoeopathy through its network of 27 research institutes/units and 07 Homoeopathic treatment centres and is carrying out intramural research including collaboration with institutes of excellence, promoting Homoeopathy and offering healthcare services through the OPDs/IPDs of its institutes/units and treatment centres. CCRH is also participating in National/ State level Arogya Melas/ Health camps/ exhibition to promote and popularize Homoeopathy among general masses. As part of IEC programme, CCRH has developed information and education material which are distributed free of cost to the general public through Exhibitions / Health Melas / Seminars/ celebration of World Homoeopathy Day/ social media, such as facebook pages, twitter account, etc. Further, Council has undertaken following Public Health Initiative programmes like Homoeopathy for Healthy teething, Swasthya Rakshan Programme, National Programme for Prevention and Control of Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases & Stroke (NPCDCS), Scheduled Caste Component plan (SC Component plan) Health camps, Participating in poshan maha abhiyan through its centres and Participating in the activities related to Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav.

(2) The National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH), a statutory body under the Ministry of Ayush has notified the National Commission for Homoeopathy (Medical Research in Homoeopathy) Regulations 2023 specifying the guidelines for undertaking research in Homoeopathy and ensuring developing the research aptitude of homoeopathic medical students and practitioners in Homoeopathic Medical Colleges throughout the Country including Haryana. Research Methodology is introduced at undergraduate level to promote young researchers. The concepts of Research Methodology for supplementing modern advancement, research and technology in Homoeopathy (SMART-Hom) have been appropriately incorporated in the regulation namely, the National Commission for Homoeopathy (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course- Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S.) Regulations, 2020.
