- (a) the specific role of State of Tamil Nadu in the Textile 2030 vision as Tamil Nadu is a major textile hub, contributing significantly to India's textile exports;
- (b) the extent of the \$350 billion textile industry target and \$100 billion export target that will be contributed by Tamil Nadu;
- (c) the details of investments made in Tamil Nadu for textile infrastructure in the last ten years along with the support that is being given to existing textile parks in Tamil Nadu to upgrade and compete globally;
- (d) the number of textile skill training centres that have been established in Tamil Nadu during the last 10 years;
- (e) the incentives being provided to Tamil Nadu-based textile industries to adopt sustainable practices and transition to circular textiles; and
- (f) the manner in which the funding has been allocated to Tamil Nadu under the National Technical Textiles Mission to boost its presence in technical textiles like automotive & medical textiles?

(a) to (f): Government in order to achieve Textile 2030 vision has been focusing on high-tech & high-growth product segments, leveraging inherent strengths, developing large scale plug and play infrastructure, keeping sustainability at the core, while ensuring large-scale livelihood opportunities, providing impetus to traditional sectors and becoming Atma-nirbhar in raw material value chain by implementing various schemes/initiatives across the country including in Tamil Nadu. The major schemes/initiatives include PM Mega Integrated Textile Regions and Apparel (PM MITRA) Parks Scheme which seeks to create a modern, integrated , world class textile infrastructure; Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme focusing on Man Made Fibre (MMF) Fabric, MMF Apparel and Technical Textiles to boost large scale manufacturing and enhancing competitiveness; SAMARTH – Scheme for Capacity Building in Textile Sector with the objective providing demand driven, placement oriented, skilling program; Silk Samagra-2 for comprehensive development of sericulture value chain ; National Handloom Development Program for end to end support for handloom sector. Ministry of Textiles is also implementing National Handicrafts Development Programme and Comprehensive Handicrafts Cluster Development Scheme for promotion of handicraft artisans. Under these schemes, support is provided for marketing, skill development, cluster development, direct benefit to artisans, infrastructure and technology support etc.

With a view to develop integrated large scale and modern industrial infrastructure facility for entire value-chain of the textile industry, the Government has approved setting up of 7 (Seven) PM Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel (PM MITRA) Parks in Greenfield/Brownfield sites with scheme outlay of Rs. 4,445 crore for the period 2021-22 to 2027-28. The Government has finalized one site in Tamil Nadu (Virudhnagar) for setting up of PM MITRA Parks. Also, 7 projects under Scheme for Integrated Textile Park (SITP) scheme have been sanctioned in Tamil Nadu. Further, 76 Small Handloom Clusters and 2 Mega Handloom Clusters have been taken up for financial assistance of Rs. 94.17 crore benefitting to 1,17,092 handloom workers. Further, a total of 681 Training Centers have been activated in the state of Tamil Nadu under Samarth.

National Technical Textiles Mission (NTTM) supports Research and Development, Business Startup, Skill Development, Export promotion, which are expected to benefit various technical textile cluster across India including Tamil Nadu. Under NTTM support provided to research and start-ups in various fields of technical textiles including Medical Textiles and Automotive Textiles. 11 Research and Development Projects in the field of Medical Textiles, Agro Textiles, Geo Textiles, Protective Textiles, Indu Tech with a budget outlay of Rs. 14.5 Crores and 2 Startup projects in Medical textiles sector with a budget outlay of Rs. 88.9 Lakhs have been approved in the State of Tamil Nadu
