PROGRESS ON NATURAL AND ORGANIC FARMING INITIATIVES

5002. Shri BENNY BEHANAN: Shri APPALANAIDU KALISETTI:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

(a) the total area under natural and organic farming in India as of 2025, along with the Statewise distribution;

(b) the total funds allocated and utilised for under initiatives to promote organic farming during last five years;

(c) the financial assistance provided to farmers for transitioning to natural and organic farming under the Government schemes; and

(d) the steps taken to enhance market linkages and certification processes for organic produce to boost farmer incomes?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण राज्य मंत्री (SHRI RAMNATH THAKUR)

(a) & (b): The Government is promoting organic farming through two schemes, namely Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana (PKVY) in all States/UTs (except North Eastern States) and Mission Organic Value Chain Development for North Eastern Region (MOVCDNER) for north eastern States. Till date, 59.74 lakh Ha area has been covered under organic farming. The State-wise distribution of area covered under organic farming is given at Annexure - I.

Under the PKVY scheme, a total of ₹2525.21 crore has been allocated over the last five years (2020-21 to 2024-25), with ₹1426.03 crore utilized. Under the MOVCDNER scheme, a total of ₹1133.00 crore has been allocated over the last five years (2020-21 to 2024-25), with ₹936.05 crore utilized.

The Union Cabinet has approved the National Mission on Natural Farming (NMNF) on 25th November 2024 as a centrally sponsored scheme to promote Natural Farming (NF). The Mission envisages to cover 7.78 lakh Ha area under NF. The State-wise allocated area is given in Annexure - II.

(c): Under the PKVY scheme, States/UTs are provided financial assistance of ₹31,500 per Ha over 3 years in the organic clusters, out of which, ₹15,000 per Ha is provided directly to farmers through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) for on-farm and off-farm organic inputs, ₹4,500 per Ha for marketing, packaging, branding, value addition etc., ₹3,000 per Ha for certification and residue analysis and ₹9,000 per Ha for training and capacity building.

Under the MOVCDNER scheme, assistance of ₹46,500 per Ha over 3 years is provided for creation of Farmers Producer Organization, support to farmers for organic inputs, etc. Out of this, assistance of ₹32,500 per Ha is provided to farmers for offfarm/ on-farm organic inputs including ₹15,000 per Ha as DBT to the farmers. One farmer can avail assistance for a maximum of 2 Ha area under both the above schemes.

Under the NMNF scheme, output based incentive of ₹4000 per acre per farmer per year up to 2 years is provided for practicing NF package of practices. Each farmer shall be eligible for support up to a maximum area of one acre.

(d): For better price realization for farmers, the Government has developed an online market linkage platform - www.jaivikkheti.in - for direct sale of organic produce by farmers to the consumers. So far, 6.22 lakh farmers have been registered under the Jaivik Kheti portal. Further, to promote marketing and ensuring quality control of organic produce, two types of organic certifications systems have been developed, as given below:

- Third Party Certification by an accredited certification agency under the National Programme for Organic Production (NPOP) of the Ministry of Commerce & Industry is aimed to promote the development of the export market. The NPOP certification covers all stages - production, processing, trading and export requirements - for organic products.
- For the domestic market, the Participatory Guarantee System (PGS-India), under the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, involves stakeholders (including farmers/producers) in decision-making. Under this system, the stakeholders assess, inspect and verify each other's production practices for certification of organic produce.
