(a) The Government is constantly monitoring all geopolitical developments

having a bearing on India's national interest. Amidst uncertainties and

challenges of geopolitical tensions and shifting equations, the Government

has taken steps to strengthen India's strategic position and protect its

national interests.

(b) Government of India has established strategic partnerships with more than 30 countries across the Global South and North. To further strengthen bilateral strategic partnerships, the Government has entered into technology partnerships with various countries including the US, Japan, the UK, the EU, among others. The Government has also undertaken negotiations for signing of Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) with key partners. Apart from strong bilateral partnerships, the Government has undertaken various foreign policy initiatives to strengthen regional and international cooperation. These include the Neighbourhood First Policy, Act East Policy, Mutual and Holistic Advancement for Security and Growth Across Regions (MAHASAGAR) initiative, Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) and Link West Policy. Other major India-led initiatives include the International Solar Alliance, Global Biofuels Alliance, Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure and India Middle East Europe Economic Corridor. In addition, through India's participation in various multilateral and plurilateral groupings like the G20, BRICS, Quad, UN and its various agencies, India has been engaging partner countries on a wide range of contemporary global issues having a bearing on India's economic and security interests.
