## **ADOPTION OF "FOCUS ON INDIA" DOCUMENT BY GERMAN CABINET**

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state :-

(a) whether 'Focus on India' document was adopted by the German

Cabinet, if so, the details thereof;

(b) the extent to which the above document would help India;

(c) whether Inter-Governmental Consultations between two countries were held in October last year; and

(d) if so, the details and the outcome thereof?

## ANSWER

## THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS

#### (SHRI KIRTI VARDHAN SINGH)

(a) Yes. German Cabinet adopted 'Focus on India' document on 16 October 2024. The document outlines a comprehensive strategy for deepening Germany's strategic partnership with India, emphasizing India's role as a democratic partner for stability and security in a shifting global landscape. It also highlights intensifying security cooperation, Green and Sustainable Development Partnership, economic, trade and agricultural cooperation, science and technology and academic linkages, multilateral cooperation, intensifying exchange across society as a whole including parliamentary contacts, skilled immigration, and overall relations of India with the EU.

(b) The document highlights the intention of the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany to focus on its relationship with India, identifying India as the partner of choice for Germany. Both sides are celebrating the 25<sup>th</sup> year of Strategic Partnership in 2025 and have intensified cooperation across various sectors ranging from trade and investments, defence and security, science and technology, education and mobility, culture and people-to-people ties. During the year 2023-24, Indo-German trade recorded highest ever figures with 33.5 billion USD. Around 50 thousand Indian

students studying in Germany, a number which has doubled in the last 5 years, are now the largest cohort of foreign students in Germany.

(c) & (d) Yes. The 7<sup>th</sup> Inter-Governmental Consultations (IGC) was held on 25 October 2024 in New Delhi, during the visit of Chancellor Olaf Scholz of Germany. The IGC plenary chaired by PM and **Chancellor Olaf Scholz was preceded by focused Ministerial tracks** on Foreign Policy & Security; Economy and Commerce; Green and Sustainable Development Partnership, Critical and Emerging Technologies and Innovation; Mobility and People-to-People ties; and Science and Technology. IGC Plenary and Ministerial meetings took stock of various aspects of our Strategic Partnership and discussed way forward in further deepening and diversifying the same. There were substantive outcomes in the areas of new and emerging technologies, defence & security, economy and trade, clean and green energy, health, triangular development cooperation, skilling, education & research, urban mobility, startups, environment among others. The complete list of outcomes of the 7<sup>th</sup> IGC is enclosed.
