MENSTRUAL HYGIENE SCHEME

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether a number of girls in rural India have dropped out/abstained from the school due to menstruation and lack of access to clean and affordable menstrual protection and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether a number of women are unable to afford sanitary napkins in the country and if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor; and
- (c) the details of funds allocated and utilized out of the total monetary outlay, under the Menstrual Hygiene Scheme of the National Health Mission, State/UT-wise?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SMT. ANUPRIYA PATEL)

(a) to (c) The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare implements the Scheme for Promotion of Menstrual Hygiene to improve menstrual hygiene among adolescent girls (10–19 years). The scheme focuses on increasing awareness on menstrual hygiene, enhancing access to sanitary napkins, and promoting safe and environmentally friendly disposal practices. Under the scheme, NHM supports States/UTs to provide sanitary napkins at subsidized rates through ASHAs using school and community platforms. In addition, several States/UTs initiatives provide low or free of cost sanitary napkins in schools, Anganwadi centers and health facilities.

The National Family Health Survey-5 (NFHS 5) data shows that the percentage of women aged 15-24 years using hygienic methods during their menstrual cycles has risen from 57.6% in NFHS-4 to 77.3 % in NFHS-5.
