SKILL INDIA DIGITAL MISSION

1357. SHRI CHANDRA PRAKASH JOSHI:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state: -

- (a) the total number of youths trained under the Skill Development Scheme (PMKVY 4.0);
- (b) whether any measurable improvement has been noticed in employment after training, if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the priority sectors for skill development under the Skill India Digital Mission; and
- (d) the details of youth undergone training in Rajasthan, district-wise?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

(SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)

(a) Under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojna (PMKVY) 4.0, 27,08,807 candidates have been trained/ oriented as on 31.10.2025.

(b) The PMKVY was evaluated by NITI Aayog in October 2020, wherein it was found that 52% of the placed candidates who had completed training under the RPL component received higher salary or felt that they will get higher salary compared to their peers who have no certification. Also, about 94% of the employers surveyed reported they would hire more candidates trained under the scheme.

Placements were tracked in the Short-Term Training (STT) component of the first three versions of the PMKVY Scheme i.e. PMKVY 1.0, PMKVY 2.0 and PMKVY 3.0 implemented from FY 2015-16 to FY 2021-22. Under PMKVY 4.0, the focus is to empower our trained candidates to choose their varied career path and they are suitably oriented for the same through On-job Training (OJT) embedded industry relevant skill courses.

(c) Under the Government of India's Skill India Mission (SIM), the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) delivers skill, re-skill and up-skill training through an extensive network of skill development centres/colleges/institutes etc. under various schemes viz. Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Sikhshan Sansthan (JSS), National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), to all the sections of the society across the country. The SIM aims at enabling youth of India to get future ready & industry ready skills.

The Skill India Digital Hub (SIDH) is a comprehensive digital platform designed to synergize and transform the skills, education, employment, and entrepreneurship landscape in India. The primary objectives of SIDH include facilitating digital access to skill development by enhancing individual competencies in digital technologies, integrating the skilling ecosystem, enhancing employability

and entrepreneurship, promoting lifelong learning, serving as an information gateway, and leveraging data-driven decision-making.

Under PMKVY 4.0, the focus is on providing skill training in emerging and New Age sectors such as cybersecurity, AI, GIG economy, Circular Economy, Renewable energy, etc.
