INCLUSION OF NAMAMI GANGE PROGRAMME UNDER AMRUT

NO. 2070. MD ABU TAHER KHAN:

Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has any plan to bring the Namami Gange Programme under the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT), if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and**
- (b) the initiatives taken by the Government to enhance the capacity of sewage treatment plants during the last five years, State-wise?**

**ANSWER

(a) There is no proposal in the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), at present, to bring the Namami Gange Programme under the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT).

(b) Sanitation is a state subject. Government of India supplements the efforts of the States through schematic interventions/ advisories. It provides financial and technical support to the States through various Missions/ Schemes such as Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) and AMRUT 2.0 to improve the basic infrastructure in urban areas which inter alia include sewerage and septage management.

AMRUT 2.0 has been launched on 01 October, 2021 in all Urban Local Bodies (ULBs)/ cities, enabling the cities to become 'self-reliant' and 'water secure'. Providing universal coverage of sewerage and septage management in 500 AMRUT cities is one of the major focus areas of AMRUT 2.0. So far, 588 sewerage/septage projects worth ₹67,840.59 crore have been approved by MoHUA. Approved projects cover 6,710.04 MLD sewage treatment capacity (new/augmentation). The State-wise details of STP under AMRUT 2.0 is given in Annexure-I.

Earlier, Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) was launched on 25 June 2015 in selected 500 cities (485 cities including 15 merged cities) and towns across the country for development of basic infrastructure including sewerage and septage management. AMRUT was subsumed under AMRUT 2.0 on its launch on 1st October 2021.

Under AMRUT, 890 sewerage/ septage management projects worth ₹34,460 crore have been grounded covering creation/ augmentation of 6,299 Million Litre per Day (MLD) sewage treatment capacity. The State-wise details of Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) under AMRUT are at Annexure-II.
