FRATRICIDES AMONG CAPF

2647. MR PATHAN YUSUF:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of suicides and fratricides among Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) personnel during the last three years, and force-wise;**
- (b) the number of CAPF personnel who have resigned their jobs since 2014, year and force-wise;**
- (c) the average working hours for CAPF personnel, force-wise;**
- (d) the average number of leaves availed by CAPF personnel in a year, since 2014, year and force-wise; and**
- (e) the number of CAPF personnel who have sought mental health services since 2014, year and force-wise details thereof?**

- (a): The number of suicides and fratricides by Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs), Assam Rifles (AR) and National Security Guard (NSG) personnel reported during the last three years is at Annexure -I.**

(b): The number of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs), Assam Rifles (AR) and National Security Guard (NSG) personnel who have resigned from services since 2014 is at Annexure – II.

(c): Generally, the working hours in Central Armed Police Forces are 8 (eight) hourly shifts. This, however, varies depending on the operational exigencies. There is necessary leave/training reserve build in the structure of Battalion so that the personnel get rest and leave. Measures have been taken to implement a transparent, rational and fair leave policy and for regulating duty hours to ensure adequate rest and leave.

(d): The Government has made a provision for 75 days leave, which includes 60 days Earned Leave and 15 days Casual Leave, for CAPFs personnel deployed in the field while for other Government Servants, there is a provision for 30 days Earned Leave and 08 days Casual Leave. It is a constant endeavor to facilitate CAPF personnel to avail admissible leave to the extent possible.

(e): Mental health support, wherever required, is being provided to the CAPF personnel through a network of CAPF hospitals, composite hospitals, unit hospitals and specialized psychiatric services. The forces conduct regular awareness programs, stress-management workshops, yoga and meditation to promote mental well-being.
