NEW NATIONAL STEEL POLICY

423. SHRI BABU SINGH KUSHWAHA:

Will the Minister of STEEL be pleased to state:

- (a) the current status of steel production, consumption and exports in the country as on date;
- (b) whether India has recently become the world's second largest steel producer, if so, whether the new "National Steel Policy 2017" is in the process of being updated accordingly;
- (c) whether the Government is working on adopting hydrogen-based technology to promote green steel production and if so, the details thereof;
- (d) whether any new industrial projects have been approved in various States of the country, including Uttar Pradesh, to expand the steel industry, create employment and support MSME units; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof, State-wise?

ANSWER

(b)to(e): India became the second largest producer of crude steel in 2018 and has maintained this position since then, as per the data released by the World Steel Association. Steel is a de-regulated sector and the Government acts as a facilitator by creating a conducive policy environment for the development of the steel sector across all states in the country, including Uttar Pradesh. Decisions such as investment, capacity addition, employment, setting up of a steel plant etc. are based on technocommercial analysis of companies. The National Steel Policy (NSP), 2017 has been introduced to guide the government and the steel sector toward creating a
