**IMPLEMENTATION STATUS OF SELF-RELIANT INDIA FUND**

718. DR. BYREDDY SHABARI:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) that have applied, been approved, rejected and are pending under Self Reliant India (SRI) Fund during the last five years, year and State-wise, particularly district-wise for Andhra Pradesh including Nandyal;
- (b) the total equity support sanctioned, released and actually deployed along with the average processing time between approval and disbursement under the SRI Fund, year and State-wise including district-wise for Andhra Pradesh;
- (c) the number of daughter funds onboarded, their committed versus drawn-down capital and the investments made into MSME, State-wise including Andhra Pradesh;
- (d) the distribution of SRI-funded MSMEs and the measurable outcomes including jobs created and revenue growth, sector-wise; and
- (e) the details of awareness or outreach programmes conducted under SRI Fund, State-wise, especially in Andhra Pradesh?

**ANSWER**

(a): Self Reliant India (SRI) Fund has been set up to infuse equity of Rs. 50,000 crore in MSMEs having potential and viability to grow larger with Rs. 10,000 crore from the Government of India and Rs. 40,000 crore through Private Equity/Venture Capital Funds. Since inception in 2021 till 31.10.2025, 671 MSMEs have been assisted with an equity infusion of Rs. 14,927 crore. As on 31.10.2025, 3 MSMEs have been assisted in Andhra Pradesh (Visakhapatnam). The State/UT-wise and year-wise details of MSMEs benefitted under SRI Fund are attached at **Annexure I**.

(b): The year-wise details of fund sanctioned, released and utilized under SRI Fund are given below:

SRI Fund is a Central Sector Scheme, under which funds are not released to the State Government. The average processing time between approval and disbursement of Funds to MSMEs is about six to nine months from the date of the proposal to date of infusion.

(c): As reported by NSIC Venture Capital Fund Limited (NVCFL), as on 31.10.2025, total 69 Daughter Funds have been empanelled with NVCFL (Mother Fund) under SRI Fund. The Daughter fund –wise details of funds committed, drawdown and invested in MSME from all investors are attached at **Annexure II**.

(d): As informed by NVCFL, since inception 2021 till 31.10.2025, total employment generated under the Scheme is estimated at 1,51,264. The sector-wise details of MSMEs benefitted in the country under SRI Fund are as given below:
