2315. SHRI RAHUL KASWAN:

Will the Minister of Women and Child Development be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the data maintained under Mission Shakti indicates a disparity at the national level between the number of cases registered against women and the number of cases that have received assistance through the Integrated Support Centres;
- (b) if so, the details of the number of cases registered against women, the services provided through Integrated Support Centres and the number of pending cases in Rajasthan, district-wise;
- (c) whether the Government is aware of issues related to shortage to staff, capacity constraints/infrastructural bottlenecks affecting the effective functioning of Integrated Support Centres in districts such as Churu;
- (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) whether the budgetary provisions made under said Mission for the current and ensuing financial years include measures to address the above-mentioned shortcoming; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (f): There is no scheme called **Integrated Support Centre** under Mission Shakti. However, One Stop Centre (OSC) is a component of the Sambal vertical under the Mission Shakti. It provides **integrated support** and assistance under one roof to women affected by violence and those in distress, both in private and public spaces. It provides services like medical aid, legal aid and advice, temporary shelter, police assistance and psycho-social counselling to needy women. Since inception i.e. 1st April, 2015 up to 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2025,

56,068 women have been assisted through these OSCs in Rajasthan including Churu district. The Ministry has also developed OSC Portal under Mission Shakti Dashboard for data management, case registration, monitoring and supervision.

As per the Mission Shakti guidelines, the Central Government provides 100% financial assistance to States and UTs under Sambal sub-scheme. Adequate staff and infrastructural support is provided for smooth operationalization of OSCs across the country including Churu district of Rajasthan. However, the implementation of the all schemes under Mission Shakti lies with the State Governments and UT Administrations. Funds are being released on the basis of guidelines of Department of Expenditure, prescribed for Single Nodal agency (SNA) or SNA SPARSH of the Public Financial Management System (PFMS).
