BENEFITS OF CENTRAL HEALTH SCHEMES

Will the **MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of pregnant women who are benefiting from Central health schemes through primary health centres in India along with details of the number of beneficiaries in each State/Union Territory, including Tripura;
- (b) the State-wise details of the number of infants vaccinated each year under the Central health schemes; and
- (c) the procedures/mechanism adopted by the Government for the implementation and monitoring of these schemes?

- (a) The number of pregnant women who benefitted from Central health schemes through primary health centres in each State/Union Territory, including Tripura are placed in Annexure I and II.
- (b) The State-wise number of infants vaccinated each year under the Central health schemes are placed in Annexure III.
- (c) The Government of India implements Central health schemes in coordination with the States & UTs. Under the National Health Mission (NHM), the Government of India provides technical guidance and financial support to States/UTs based on the proposals submitted by them through the annual Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs).

To monitor the progress of these schemes, the Government conducts periodic regional and state-level review meetings, field visits to various States/UTs, and Common Review Missions (CRMs). The key steps taken by the Government of India are as follows:

- Communications through multiple channels with State Governments including letters, videoconferencing, etc.
- Popularizing the Scheme through Information, Education & Communication (IEC) & Behaviour Change Communication (BCC) strategies including mass media.
- Field level workers like ANMs, ASHAs and CHOs are promoting this programme at the ground level through interpersonal communication.
- A system of regular supportive supervisory visits to the states and districts to monitor the implementation of schemes is in place.
