4638. SHRI JAGANNATH SARKAR:

Will the **MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:-

- (a) the details of the present sanctioned strength, working strength and vacancies of teaching and non-teaching staff at the All India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health, discipline-wise;
- (b) the details of the reasons for the prolonged vacancies, particularly in key public health specialisations, during the last three years;
- (c) the current status of academic and research infrastructure, including classrooms, laboratories, hostels, the library and digital facilities;
- (d) whether the same are adequate to meet present academic needs and if so, the details thereof;
- (e) the details of funds sanctioned, released and utilised for infrastructure upgradation and maintenance during the last three financial years; and
- (f) whether any time-bound plan has been approved to address staffing shortages and modernise infrastructure to strengthen the Institute's role in national public health capacity building and if so, the details thereof?
