ALLOCATION OF FUNDS TO KSVY

5000. Ms. Mahua Moitra:

Will the **MINISTER OF CULTURE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of reason for the reduction in the funds allocated towards the Kala Sanskriti Vikas Yojana (KSVY) by almost 60 per cent in Budget Estimate (BE) 2026-27, as compared to Revised Estimate (RE) 2025-26;
- (b) the details of allocation and utilisation of funds towards each of the sub-schemes under the KSVY, since 2014, scheme and year-wise;
- (c) the details of beneficiaries under the sub-scheme of Financial Assistance for Construction of Tagore Cultural Complexes (TCC), since 2014, year and State/UT-wise; and
- (d) the details of religious institutions benefited under the sub-scheme of Seva Bhoj Yojana, since inception of the scheme, year and State/UT-wise?

- (a) There is no proposal under consideration to reduce the funds allocated to the Kala Sanskriti Vikas Yojana (KSVY).
- (b) The KSVY scheme came into existence as an umbrella scheme from Financial Year 2017-18. This Ministry doesn't maintain utilization of funds sub-scheme/ component wise, however, overall allocation & expenditure from FY 2017-18 onward is as follows:-
