**IMPLEMENTATION OF MISSION SHAKTI SUB-SCHEMES**

5622. SHRI GANESH SINGH:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the current status of the implementation of Mission Shakti (2021–26), separately for its two sub-schemes Sambal (Safety and Security) and Samarthya (Empowerment), including the number of One Stop Centres, women helplines, hostels, crèches and training initiatives operational;
- (b) the details of the funds allocated/released/utilised under the said Mission along with key outcomes such as beneficiaries covered, services delivered and grievance redressal timelines, State-wise and district-wise;
- (c) whether the Government has conducted any impact assessment to measure improvements in women's safety, access to support services, livelihood outcomes and participation in skilling and employment under the said Mission, if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the current status of the implementation of said Mission in Madhya Pradesh, district-wise specifically the coverage and outcomes in Satna district under both Sambal and Samarthya components?

**ANSWER**

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT  
(SHRIMATI SAVITRI THAKUR)

(a) to (d): Mission Shakti aims at strengthening interventions for women safety, security and empowerment. Mission Shakti comprises of two verticals 'Sambal' for safety and security of women and 'Samarthya' for empowerment of women. Mission Shakti is Centrally Sponsored Scheme and the implementation lies with the State Governments and UT Administrations.

Sambal has components of One Stop Centre (OSC), Women Helpline (WHL), Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) and Nari Adalat (Nari Adalat). Samarthya has components of Shakti Sadan, Sakhi Niwas, Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY), Palna and SANKALP: Hub for Empowerment of Women (SANKALP: HEW).

One Stop Centre (OSC) provides integrated and immediate support and assistance under one roof to women affected by violence and those in distress, both in private and public spaces all across the country. It provides services like medical aid, legal aid and advice, temporary shelter, police assistance and psycho-social counselling to needy women. Since inception, i.e. 1st April, 2015 up to 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2025, over 13.37 lakh women have been assisted in the country. Women Helpline (WHL-181) provides 24-hour toll-free telecommunication services to support women in both emergency and non-emergency situations. It offers assistance to women affected by violence and provides information about government schemes and services all across the country. Since inception till 28th February, 2026, over 99.09 lakh women have been assisted through Women Helpline in the country. Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) Scheme was launched to help address Child Sex Ratio (CSR) and related issues of empowerment of girls and women over a life cycle continuum. Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) scheme has transformed from policy initiative into national movement by mobilizing various stakeholders, including government agencies, media civil society and general public. Nari Adalat is a pilot initiative aimed at empowering women by ensuring justice and to offer services such as alternate dispute resolution, grievance redressal, counselling, evidence-based decision-making, pressure group tactics, negotiation, mediation, and reconciliation at Gram Panchayat level.

Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) is a maternity benefit scheme under which cash incentives flow to beneficiaries through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode for the first child and the second girl child. Shakti Sadan is an integrated relief and rehabilitation home for women in distress situations, including trafficked women. Sakhi Niwas provides safe and conveniently located accommodation for working women. SANKALP: Hub for Empowerment of Women (HEW) facilitates inter-sectoral convergence of schemes and programmes meant for women at the national, State/UT, and district levels.

Mission Shakti is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme and overall implementation of the Scheme lies with the State Government and UT Administration. Funds are being released on the basis of guidelines of Department of Expenditure, prescribed for Single Nodal agency (SNA) or SNA SPARSH of the Public Financial Management System (PFMS). Fund released/expenditure under Mission Shakti for FY 2022-23 is Rs.2335.25 Crore, for FY 2023-24 is Rs.1514.54, for FY 2024-25 is Rs.1832.88. The details of women assisted/beneficiaries across the country and in the State of Madhya Pradesh including Satna district since inception under Mission Shakti are at **Annexure**.

Further, once in a year, the Programme Approval Board (PAB) monitors with States and UTs the progress of activities under the scheme and reviews status of achievement of objectives, effective delivery of services to women and children including rural and marginalized communities. Apart from this, officials of the Ministry continuously review the scheme through meetings, video conferencing and by making field visits to States/UTs from time to time.

Two third party evaluations of the schemes of the Ministry, including the Mission Shakti Umbrella Scheme have been conducted in 2020 and again in 2025 through NITI Aayog. The studies have found the relevance, effectiveness and sustainability of the scheme as satisfactory.
