Will the Minister of PANCHAYATI RAJ be pleased to state:

a) the manner in which “One Nation, One Map” initiative is being implemented to support data consistency, evidence-based planning and efficient utilisation of public resources at the State and Panchayati Raj level, State-wise including Karnataka;

(b) the number of Central and State departments integrated with the platform, the coverage achieved across districts resource saving and Gram Panchayats and examples of major planning or development decisions informed through its use, State-wise including Karnataka;

(c) whether institutional mechanisms have been put in place for regular data updating, interoperability and controlled access to ensure accuracy and security of geospatial data and regular use by State and Panchayati Raj Institutions;

(d) if so, the details thereof, State-wise including Karnataka; and

(e) the details of the “One Nation, One Map” in the Palghar district of Maharashtra State and coverage in the district?

ANSWER

(a) “One Nation, One Map” means all the diverse geospatial information and maps from various departments integrated into common platform, enabling the common man to use maps for evidence-based planning. Ministry of Panchayati Raj is not leading any such initiative namely “One Nation One Map”. However, under Geo-spatial policy 2022 developed by Department of Science and Technology (DST), data consistency is ensured through standardized national and sectoral datasets aligned with international standard themes and made accessible via the National Geospatial Data Registry (NGDR). SoI is the agency responsible for developing and operating the National Geospatial Data Registry (NGDR) and the Unified Geospatial Interface (UGI). SoI acts as a facilitator in harmonization of data sets created using public funds. This ensures that data generated from various mapping activities is seamlessly integrated into a common Reference Framework.

(b) and (d) Under National Geo-spatial policy 2022, integration of multiple Central and State government departments is done through standardized data sharing via NGDR and UGI; however, the policy framework does not specify exact numbers of departments onboarded or district-wise and Gram Panchayat-level coverage. Its pan-India design enables widespread utilization across States, including Karnataka, supporting district and Panchayat-level planning. Geo-spatial Policy framework is a nation wide policy.

(c) Under National Geo-spatial policy 2022, Geospatial Data Promotion and Development Committee (GDPDC) shall be the apex national body for formulating and implementing appropriate guidelines, strategies and programs for promotion of activities related to collection, generation, preparation, dissemination, storage, publication, updating and/or digitization of Geospatial data along with associated products, solutions and services.

(e) Ministry is not implementing any such initiative named 'One Nation, One Map.'
