3738. SHRI S. RAJENDRAN:

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Satellite Communication (SATCOM) Policy authorises the use of INSAT satellites by the non-government sector;
- (b) if so, the list of non-government sector who operate private communication satellites;
- (c) whether the Government has any plan to enable the use of INSAT satellites by the non-government sectors; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PG & PENSIONS AND IN THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE (DR. JITENDRA SINGH):

- (a) Yes Madam.
- (b) No Indian private entities own and operate a private communication satellite. However, a large number of private / non-government users use INSAT satellites for broadcasting and interactive services.
- (c) Yes Madam.

(d) A large number of private / non-government users in Direct to Home (DTH), Television uplink, Digital Satellite News Gathering (DSNG), Very Small Aperture Terminals (VSAT) sectors are using INSAT/GSAT satellites for providing services.
