PROTECTION OF HARBOURS FROM NUCLEAR RADIATION

*174. DR. C. GOPALAKRISHNAN:

Will the Minister of SHIPPING be pleased to state:

- (a) the existing mechanism put in place to provide safety and security to major ports in the country;
- (b) whether any safety audit of major ports undertaken, if so, the outcome thereof along with corrective action taken to improve safety of ports;
- (c) whether the Government has installed/proposes to install latest equipment to protect the harbours from nuclear radiation and if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the harbours where such equipment have been installed/proposed to be installed, port-wise; and
- (e) the budget allocated and utilised for the purpose and the time by which these equipment are likely to be installed at all the harbours across the country?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (A) TO (E) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 174 FOR ANSWER ON 10TH DECEMBER, 2015 RAISED BY DR. C. GOPALAKRISHNAN REGARDING PROTECTION OF HARBOURS FROM NUCLEAR RADIATION

- (a) All Major Ports are ISPS (International Ship and Port Facility Security Code) compliant issued by International Maritime Organization which envisages an assessment of security threat for the port by a recognised security organisation and establishment of the roles and responsibilities of Government security agencies. In addition, the Government has taken significant steps to upgrade the security at Major ports by Installation of Vessel Traffic Management System (VTMS), Issuance of biometric I-cards to port functionaries, acquisition of speed boats & patrolling boats. Government has also deployed Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) in all the Major Ports.
- (b) Directorate General of Shipping conducts safety audit of Major Ports every year. Shortfall, if any, noted during audit have to be made good to ensure that the port continues to be ISPS compliant.
- (c)to(e): The Government had directed all Major Ports to place orders for purchase/installation of Radioactive Detection Equipments (RDEs) on Electronic Corporation of India Limited (ECIL) out of their own resources. ECIL has already completed installation in all the Major Ports except Mumbai Port and Jawaharlal Nehru Port where installation is in its last stages. The details may be seen at Annexure-I. All Maritime States were also requested to install RDEs at their ports.
