- (a) the mechanism in place to showcase India's rich culture and heritage in foreign countries;
- (b) the number of cultural centres established so far in various states/UTs;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to set up new cultural centres in various countries including the SAARC countries under the cultural exchange programmes and if so, the details thereof along with the funds allocated for setting up such centres during the last three years and the current year, year and country-wise; and
- (d) whether the Government has received any proposal from various State Governments for setting up of new cultural centres abroad and if so, the details thereof along with the action taken by Government thereon?

STATEMENT REFFERED TO IN REPLY TO PART (a) to (d) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. *309 FOR 21.12.2015 REGARDING CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES.

a) The Festivals of India (FoI) are conducted abroad for spreading Indian culture abroad and enhancing people to people contact through dance, performance, food festival, exhibition, literary festival, film festival, Yoga, Mehandi art etc.

Ministry of Culture aims at disseminating Indian culture in new territories and develops the cultural relations between India and various countries of the world through Cultural Agreements and Cultural Exchange Programmes (CEPs). The CEPs signed between Ministry of Culture and Cultural Ministries of various countries are circulated to implementing agencies for its implementation. As per provision of CEPs cultural delegations/groups are sent on reciprocal basis.

Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) also actively implements CEPs through its programmes on receiving and sending cultural delegations/groups to and from foreign countries. Indian Missions and ICCR are jointly involved in promotion of culture through their Culture wings and Culture Centres respectively abroad.

b) Ministry of Culture have set up seven Zonal Cultural Centres (ZCCs) with headquarters at Patiala, Nagpur, Udaipur, Allahabad, Kolkata, Dimapur and Thanjavur to preserve, promote the culture including folk dance, music and literature of different regions and these ZCCs conduct folk festivals/ events at national/ internationals level through various schemes.

ICCR has 20 regional centres in 19 states as at **Annexure- I**, for organizing cultural events of the cultural groups/artists received from abroad.

- c) At present ICCR is running 36 Culture Centres abroad including in the SAARC countries as enumerated in **Annexure-II**. It is in the process of establishing eight new Culture Centres in Washington, Paris, Buenos Aires, Lagos, Toronto, Sydney, Hanoi and Singapore.
- Rs. 5.5 Crores has been allocated under ICCR budget for financial year 2015-2016 for meeting recurring expenditure on new Indian Culture Centres.
