- (a) whether India's ranking has improved to 55<sup>th</sup> in the Global Competitiveness Index (GCI);
- (b) if so, the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the above progress made is overshadowed by the low rankings in budget deficit, quality of electricity supply and technology readiness for consumers; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor along with the corrective steps taken by the Government in this regard?

## ANSWER
