TRADE OF IMPURE GOLD

- (a) whether the impure gold trade is increasing in various parts of the country; and
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the action taken/proposed to be taken to check it?

(a) & (b): No Madam. However, the results of a market Survey for purity of Gold conducted in 2006 in 16 cities/towns showed that 146 samples out of the 162 samples tested failed. The average shortage of purity on an All India basis was 13.15 percent. The Government is, therefore, trying to encourage 'hallmarking' of jewellery since hallmarked jewellery guarantees purity of gold
