(a) to (e): In order to develop textile industry at par with international standards in terms of quality, Government has initiated action for modifying ongoing schemes namely Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme (TUFS), Scheme for Integrated Textile Parks (SITP), Scheme for the Development of Powerloom Sector, National Handloom Development Programme (NHDP), Reform and Restructuring (RRR) package for Handloom, etc as well as taking new initiatives. These measures envisage setting of new units as well as expansion/ modernization of the existing units in various segments of the textile industry with emphasis on skill, scale and speed under the Make in India initiatives. For facing the global competition, Skilling has been given emphasis and 4,75,372 persons have been trained under the Integrated skill Development Scheme, (upto November, 2015). These steps taken in consultation with the State Governments seek to promote textile industry on a holistic basis for meeting domestic demand as well as boosting exports.
