**Religious Books in Schools**

- (a) whether the Government is considering to include Gita, Vedas and other religious books in the school curriculum;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the rationale behind including these books in the school education;
- (c) whether the Government propose to frame new education policy in this regard and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the steps taken or being taken by the Government to maintain secular character of Indian education system?
