Note: Since 29.10.2015 MEIS has expanded its scope to 110 new tariff lines and has increased rates or country coverage or both for 2228 existing tariff lines.

(b) & (c): Yes, the government is prioritizing on production of value added and quality textiles products and is focusing on "zero defect and zero effect initiatives under Make in India.

  - (vi) Duty Free import of trimmings, embellishments and other specified item under Export Performance Certificate Entitlement Scheme.

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
