- (d) whether some banks are providing details of the schemes to the farmers and if so, the details thereof?

(a) & (b): Village Knowledge Centres (VKC) is a programme of Council for Advancement of People's action and Rural Technology (CAPART) under the Ministry of Rural Development and was initiated on pilot basis by the Government in the past under the Rural Technology Scheme of CAPART under Ministry of Rural Development.

The main objective of Village Knowledge Centres (VKC) was to have an online interactive sessions from central studio to multiple remote sites to address need based issues at grass root level.

(c): CAPART had set up two VKCs on pilot basis as per the details below:

2	Dhan Foundation, 18, Pillaiyar Street, Soma Sundram Colony, Madurai, Tamilnadu	Tamil Nadu, having central studio at Pulluthi People Academy, Madurai connecting 10 remote sites in 3 districts of Tamil Nadu.	This centre was not provided operational cost due to discontinuation of VKC programme.

(d): Providing details of the programme to the farmers through banks was not the objective of above mentioned pilot projects.
