- (a) whether there is a huge shortage of manpower in the Central Government Departments;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether it is a fact that the recruitment of staff is not proportionate to the posts vacated by retired employees; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof along with the measures taken to improve the staff strength in the Government departments?

- (c) & (d): The data regarding recruitment of staff vis-à-vis posts vacated by retirement of employees is not maintained. However, the posts sanctioned in Government Ministries/ Departments are required to be filled as per the Recruitment Rules as and when vacancies arise.
