- (a) and (b): Government of India has drafted National Civil Aviation Policy which is to be finalized. It provides for a Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) by way of::
- i) Revival of un-served or under-served aerodromes and airstrips.
- ii) Concessions by different stakeholders:
- iii) Viability Gap Funding (VGF) for scheduled commuter airlines
- iv) Cost-effective security solutions by BCAS and State Governments.
- (c): The draft National Civil Aviation Policy provides for the revivial of air strips as no-frills airports mostly through Airports Authority of India (AAI) depending on demand, AAI has undertaken works at five locations namely Hubely and Belgaum in Karnataka, Kishangarh in Rajasthan, Jhansuguda in Orissa and Teju in Arunachal Pradesh.
