**DD TERRESTRIAL NETWORK**

**972. SHRI RAJESHBHAI CHUDASAMA:**

Will the MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

- (a) the percentage of rural viewers who are accessing Doordarshan (DD) through its terrestrial network;
- (b) the percentage of the total expenditure of Doordarshan that is spent on terrestrial distribution;
- (c) the progress of terrestrial digitization of Doordarshan so far; and
- (d) whether the Prasar Bharati Expert Committee has suggested for switching off Doordarshan's analog terrestrial broadcasts and if so, the timeline for implementing the same?

- (a) Prasar Bharati has informed that currently, the viewership data received does not show the terrestrial viewership for rural viewers separately. However, the total viewership of DD Channel over the last 6 weeks is placed at Annexure-A.
- (b) Annually, around 29% of the total expenditure of Doordarshan is spent on terrestrial distribution.
- (c) In January, 2003, Doordarshan had set up four digital transmitters, one each at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai on an experimental basis using Digital Video Broadcasting Transmission (DVB-T) System, to gain experience in digital transmission technology. As part of the 11<sup>th</sup> Plan Scheme, 4 High Definition TV (HDTV) digital High Power Transmitters (HPTs) have been installed at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata & Chennai and are ready for commissioning. 63 digital HPTs (40 Nos in 11<sup>th</sup> Plan and 23 Nos in 12<sup>th</sup> Plan) have also been approved as part of digitization schemes. Out of 63 digital HPTs, 16 digital HPTs are ready for commissioning and another 3 digital HPTs are at advanced stage of completion. Action has been initiated for setting up of remaining 44 digital HPTs.
- (d) The Committee has recommended digitization of Terrestrial TV operations based on commercial viability. At present, there is no time-line for Analog Terrestrial TV Switch off.
