Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES, RIVER DEVELOPMENT AND GANGA REJUVENATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is organising awareness/training programmes for public including women to educate them on water conservation management;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the number of such programmes organised and the number of participants especially women provided training during each of the last three years and the current year in the country, State/UT-wise; and
- (c) the extent of success achieved through these programmes?

ANSWER

(a) & (b) Yes, Madam. The Ministry of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation, Government of India, has organized awareness/capacity building programmes for different stakeholders including public on water conservation management through various organizations like Central Ground Water Board (CGWB), Central Water Commission (CWC), National Institute of Hydrology (NIH) and National Water Mission (NWM). As of now, about 433 training programmes have been organized, 43,375 participants attended these programmes, which includes 9,864 women participants during the last three years and current financial year (2015-16).

In addition to the above, 336 mass awareness programmes have been organized by the Ministry through CWC, NIH and NWM during the last three years and the current financial year.

State-wise/UT-wise details are enclosed at Annexures -I (a), I (b), and II to V.

(c) These capacity building/awareness programmes for different stakeholders are fruitful in building capacity, creating awareness and educating them on water conservation and management including water quality. The interactions/discussions held during such programmes are also useful in adopting better water conservation and management practices in the field.
