(a) & (b): Indian Coast Guard had started induction of women officers from the year 1997 as permanent appointee in General Duty (GD) and Aviation cadre (Pilots). Further, Short Service Appointee (SSA) women officer including Commercial Pilot Licence (CPL) holders were also inducted from year 2010. As on date, there are 27 women officers (17 Pilots and 10 Observers). They are employed for aviation duties involved in discharging Indian Coast Guard charter including prevention of illegal activities at sea and surveillance at maritime boundary lines.
