### Falling Sick after Consuming Deworming Drugs

1675. SHRI R. DHRUVA NARAYANA:

Will the Minister of CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of children who fell sick after consuming deworming tablets on the National Deworming Day on 10<sup>th</sup> February, 2016;
- (b) whether the Government has taken any step to investigate the reasons behind the children falling sick from consuming the deworming tablet; and
- (c) whether the Government tested the Albendazole tablets before and after they were administered throughout the nation, if so, the finding thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

#### **ANSWER**

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI HANSRAJ GANGARAM AHIR)

- (a): Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has informed that as per available information from the States, 737 children experienced mild nausea and vomiting during National Deworming day 2016 from  $10^{th}$  Feb to  $15^{th}$  Feb, 2016.
- (b) & (c): Albendazole is a very safe drug, but 1-2 percent of the children may develop mild side effects in the form of nausea and vomiting. These side effects are particularly common in children having high load of worm infection. The side effects are generally self limiting. States have a regular system of checking samples of drugs, including albendazole tablets after procurement, as a routine quality control measure.
