(a) whether it is a fact that farmers in Assam are facing lack of irrigation facilities;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether it is also a fact that due to lack of irrigation farmers are in starvation like condition;

(d) if so, the details of funds sanctioned and released to Assam for irrigation schemes during the last three years; and

(e) the details of action taken by the Government to enhance the irrigation system in Assam?

(a) & (b): As per available estimates (2012-13), the net sown area of Assam State is about 2.81 million ha, of which nearly 0.161 million ha area is covered under irrigation.

(c): Agriculture operations in rainfed/dry land areas are mostly dependant on rainfall. These areas are vulnerable to water stress and deficit rainfall. However, there is no starvation condition of farmers in the State.

(d): Funds provided to Government of Assam for various irrigation/water conservation/water management schemes during the last three years is as under:

With an aim to enhance irrigation coverage and improve water use efficiency in the country including Assam, Government has launched Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) w.e.f. 1st July, 2015. PMKSY envisages end-to-end solutions in irrigation supply chain, viz. water sources, and distribution network and farm level applications. PMKSY is to be implemented in an area development approach, adopting decentralized state level planning and projectised execution, allowing the states to draw their irrigation development plans based on district/blocks plans with a horizon of 5 to 7 years. States can take up projects based on the District/State Irrigation Plan.
