(d): The Department of Agriculture, Cooperation and Farmers Welfare, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare is implementing the scheme Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture for enhancing production and productivity of horticultural crops including spices. Under this Mission, development programmes are implemented wherein financial assistance is provided to the producers of spices. The major components of the schemes are; area expansion (establishment of new garden), rejuvenation/replanting of old and senile gardens, production and distribution of quality planting materials, Integrated Pest and Disease Management, Integrated Nutrient Management, organic farming, mechanization, Integrated Post-harvest Management, development of market yards, technology dissemination through frontline demonstration and Human Resource Development etc.
